BUTTE CREEK CANYON ROADWORK

Butte County is in the process of awarding a construction contract for the reconstruction of Honey Run and Centerville Roads, which were severely damaged during the 2018 Camp Fire. The project is funded through federal emergency relief programs—including the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) program. As such, the scope of work is limited to "in-kind" restoration—rebuilding the roadways to their pre-disaster condition within the existing roadway prism.

The project is expected to include: Full-depth roadway reconstruction; Drainage and erosion control repairs; Restoration of damaged roadway shoulders and slopes; Traffic safety elements (e.g., striping, and minor guardrail adjustments where applicable)

We are currently in the pre-construction phase, with scheduling, submittals, and traffic control planning to follow once the contract is finalized. Based on current estimates and weather considerations, construction is anticipated to begin this summer, with completion expected by late fall 2025.

During construction, residents should expect intermittent lane closures and temporary delays. However, the County will coordinate closely with the contractor to ensure that local access and emergency response routes are maintained at all times. Additional public notifications will be provided in advance of major construction activity.


